The criminal asizes are over, and the grand jury in its presentment regrets the number of indictments for offences against women. If whipping has been proved to prevent these crimes, then they strongly urge that its infliction in these cases be authorized by law in this country.

Regarding persons who have once been convicted of crime, they must find it very difficult to make an honest living. If the state ensures to the discharged prisoners a reasonable chance of an honest existence, then those who persist in a life of crime should be deprived of a further opportunity of of-
