and have nothing." You may sow grass seed either as soon as the snow is off the ground, or, as some say, in Augt. or Sept. You may see the time for this purpose discussed in "Fessenden's Complete Farmer," pages 22, 24. Be sure to use seed enough, say about 12lbs of clover and one peck of herd's (timothy) grass to the acre. Have your wood cut up and piled away for summer use, it is very bad economy to be obliged to leave your work in haying or harvesting, to draw and cut cattle from every now and then, a little green wood to cook with. In this month the sheep will begin to bring forth their lambs—the utmost care and attention are requisite to preserve the lambs. It is said that more than half the human race die before they are two years old; and it is very probable that half the lambs die before they see two weeks—this mortality is probably produced by inattention to the dictates and requirements of nature, rather than as the results of physical laws.
