Among the matters likely to provoke considerable discussion is a recommenda-tion from the bills and by-laws committee to increase the license fee for moving picture shows from \$75 a year to \$50 a month or \$600 a year. While it is un-likely that this recommendation will be adopted, it is probable that some increase will be made, probably \$200 a year. If the moving picture shows are charged a higher rate, the Opera House charged, which is now \$100 a year, will also in all probability be advanced to \$200. 

Marblehead, Mass., May 31.—Half a score of yachts designed solely for along shore sailing, will venture far out into the Atlantic this week on the third of the ocean races to Bermuda. The start this year will be from Marble-head Rock at 11 a. m. on Wednesday, instead of from New York as on the two previous occasions, and the course, there-fore, will be thirty miles farther, giving the yachts 675 miles to cover before reaching the finish off St. Davids Head Light.
