INDIAN LAND SALE.

The following lands in the Township of Anderton, in the County of Essex, being part of the Indian Reserve there, also Little Turkey Island in the Detroit river, and Fawn Island in the River St. Clair, will be offered for sale at public auction in the Town Hall of Amherstburg, on Tuesday, the 23rd day of November next, at the hour of noon, lots numbers 6, 7, 8, 9, and the south half of 10, in the 6th concession. Lots numbers 6, 7, 8, 9, and the south half of 10 in the 7th concession. Lots numbers 6, 7, 8, 9, and the south half of 10 in the 8th concession, containing in all 2,700 acres.

These lands are situated in the heart of a fine agricultural district about twelve miles distant from the town of Windsor, and six from Amherstburg, and are not excelled in quality by any lands in the country.

They will be offered for sale in separate 100 acre lots, a few of which are obliquely intersected by the Canada Southern railway, and are subject to deduction on that account.

Little Turkey Island is in the Detroit river, and is well known as a valuable fishing station. Fawn Island, in the River St. Clair, is situated opposite the 10th concession of the Township of Sombra, and is known by the several names of Fawn, Tick, and Belle Riviere Island.
