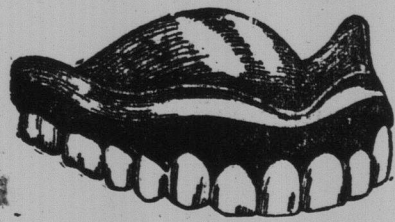

The returned soldiers from the Parks Convalescent Home and the Discharge Depot were the guests of the St. John Power Boat Club last evening. Leaving about 7 o'clock, there was a sail up the St. John river in the flag officers' boats and on the return to the club house a beautiful repast was served by the ladies of the club. Following this came a short musical programme which was participated in by Misses Mullin and Kierwan and Messrs. O'Dell, McLennan and Flawelling. Several gramophone selections were also provided through the kindness of John Frodsham and the rest of the time was pleasantly spent in dancing. It is the intention of the Power Boat Club to repeat these entertainments for the returned soldiers monthly during the season.

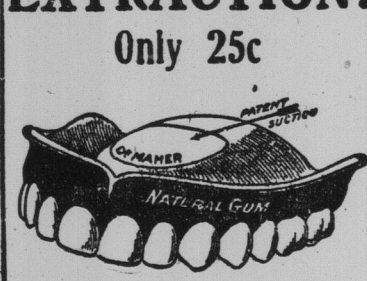

## Will The German Upheaval Break The Kaiser's Yoke?

"The Imperial Government is now on the defensive at home, and is compelled to deal in concrete fashion with the growing dissatisfaction of the German people," is a significant fact that stands out clearly and distinctly, in the opinion of the New York World. Nevertheless, in the minds of other cautious American editors, we are warned not to expect too much from the crisis in Berlin, for Germany is not Russia, nor is Wilhelm a Nicholas.
