GERMAN ARMY PAY IS CUT

Salaries of All Officers Are to Be Reduced October 1.

Berlin, Sept. 28.—Beginning October 1, says the Overseas News Agency, the pay of all German officers will be reduced. The salaries of the minister of war and the chief army commander will be reduced by 10 per cent. (2500) a month and of lieutenants by sixty marks (\$15). Married officers and those who have parents depending upon them enjoy special indemnities.
