

sions. But the world's wheat-consuming population is growing, according to Canadian Trade Review. The pictures represent a growth of about 58 per cent. since 1871. The reason fo this increase is that wheat bread is coming into more general favor in Asia, Africa, South America, and the continent of Europe. Besides, wheat consumers use about 26 per cent. per capita more now than they didden 1871. The world's production of wheat in 1871 was 1,300,000,000 bushels, and, in 1909, 3,457,600,000 bushels, an increase of 84 per cent. Even this immense increase is not sufficient to supply the demand. In the United States and Great Britain about 26 per cent. of the average family income is spent for grain products, and, of this amount about 40 per cent. is for wheat. As Canada has, as yet, scarcely crossed the threshold of her wheat-producing potentialities, she is bound to minister in future in an ever greater degree to the world's demand for wheat.
