Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, who has been a resident in Canada for at least one year, and in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, or Alberta, the applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties—Six months' residence upon an entitlement of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may file within the limits of his homestead a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section along his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to carry homesteaded patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has cultivated his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$10.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.00. W. W. CORY, Deputy of the Minister of the Interior, N.
