JR. VORONOFF IN N. Y. READY TO OPERATE

"Monkey Gland" Surgeon Is Certain of Success - Willing to Use Human Interstitial if One May Be Had.

(New York Evening Post.) Interest was manifested in medical cir-Interest was manifested in medical circles today over the announcement of Dr. Serges Voronoff that he intends to emonstrate he can restore youth, health and vigor to the aged or ill, by transferring the interstitial gland from one man to another, Dr. Voronoff, who is said to have transplanted glands from chimpanzees to men, arrived here Saturday from Paris.

Dr. Voronoff said today that he feels confident he can take the interstitial gland from a youth killed by an accident or electrocuted in prison and graft it to a man, and arrive at the same favorable results that have marked his numerous operations of a similar nature on goats, sheep and the four members of the monkey family on which he has been experimenting.

Dr. Voronoff believes that the only obstacle to the success of the proposed operations will be the securing of subjects who will volunteer to have their operations will be the securing of sub-jects who will volunteer to have their interstitial gland removed. Many youths he said, already have offered to part with their interstitial glands, but have de-manded such exhorbitant sums of money undergo the operation that it coul

not be considered.

However, if the surgeons here can bring forward a man who is willing to submit to the experiment, Dr. Voronoff is ready to go ahead and perform it in the presence of any body representing the medical fraternity. Whether the authorities would consider to his removing the gland of a man just killed is another matter that has to be decided. Couldn't Get Glands.

Dr. Voronoff declared that he would have attempted the transplanting of human glands months ago but for the fact that the French Government forbids the mutilation of the dead. Under the French law he could not remove the interstitial gland of a dead man even for scientific purposes.

It discussing his experiment Dr. Voronoff said:

"Before I accepted for a certainty hat the experiment could be accomplished with the results I noted, I performed upward of 180 gland transplanting operations. There is no doubt in my mind that the gland of a monkey will not only prolong life but restore health and vigor as well.

"One thing appears certain to me. In due time there will be monkey farms conducted just as you conduct farms here for the raising of horses. Recognizing the value of monkey glands to humanity, the will become more necessary than medicines. And the future of humanity will be found in the virgin forests of the Congo, where chimpanzees abound."

Dr. Voronoff was born in Russia but is a naturalized French citizen. For twelve years he was chief surgeon to the Khedive of Egypt. It was during the war that he first achieved fame by his properly also one properly he operations in hone and skin remarkable operations in bone and skin grafting. He is director of the laboratory of experimental surgery at the College of France. His wife, who came here with him from Paris a month ago, is the daughter of the late Jabez A. Bostwick of the Standard Oil Company. She assists her husband in the laboratory during his experiments.



"After weeks of conferences with Gregory Krassin over Soviet Russia's proposals to grant "concessions" to the rest of the world in return for the restablishment of trade relations; after a bitter international debate in which Great Britain's stand very nearly precipitated a break between herself and her ally, France, and after arriving at a point where an almost immediate resumption of commerce might have been expected, the deal is off.
"It was given out authoritatively today that all trade negotiations with Russia should be definitely ended for the present and that Russia must expect no more conferences until she has absolutely put a stop to her army campaigns against Poland.

"Great Britain today sent out a decisive categoric message to the Moscow government. It left no room for evasion. It told the Russians promptly, but firmly, that they need not send any more trade delegates to London with any expectation of a hearing.
