Housing Problem Depends on Land Problem, Says Prof. Sissons

Social Welfare Session - Many Speakers Urge Reforms and Education of Opinion

"All your education fails, all your hoarded money fails, unless you have growing up everywhere throughout the country happy families of children com-fortably housed in attractive surround-ings," said Professor C. B. Sissons, sec-retary of the Ontario Housing Commis-sion, giving the first address at yester-day afternoon's session of the Social Welfare Congress, held at 21 McGill street, with D. B. Harkness of Winni-peg presiding. Professor Sissons out-lined the history of the movement for better housing in Ontario. In the course of this sketch he referred to the recog-nition of state responsibility in the United States by the appropriation of \$175,000,000 toward war housing; of the recognition of state responsibility in England as far back as 1851, and of the appropriation on Dec. 2 of \$25,000,000 for housing in Canada. In the United States, he said, the grant was simply a war measure, but in Canada it shows that in peace as well as in war the gov-comment recognizes its responsibility. at in peace as well as in war the govnt recognizes its responsibility.

"You can never settle the housing problem until you do something to set-tle the land problem," said the speaker, and spoke of the laying out of streets and the placing of houses and of the iniquity of having apartment houses on the outskirts of the eity, outside the city limits, where every family ought to fground. Attractive, convenient and sanitary homes, he said, ought to be within the reach of the ordinary wage-carner, some of whom were now pay.


