HERE'S A NEW ONE; FROMOTER'S SCHEME TO "SEE ROUND WORLD"

Vignoli Has to Answer Charge of Getting Money Under False Pretences By an Amazing Tale

Spokane, Wash., Sept. 26.—Phillipe Vignoli, former associate of Marconi, inventor of wireless telegraphy, who was apprehended in Los Angeles several months ago on the charge of obtaining \$2,000 by false pretences from Antonio Scarpelli, a local contractor, has made J. Rufus Wallingford's most ambitious promotion schemes appear as the work of a novice, according to testimony presented at a trial now in progress before Judge E. H. Sullivan and a jury in the Spokane county superior court in this city.
