Book Packets and Patterns may be forwarded in the closed Mails between New Brunswick and the United Kingdom, via the United States, on such packets a total rate of postage of four pence sterling or eight cents currency per quarter of a pound or fraction thereof, will be chargeable.

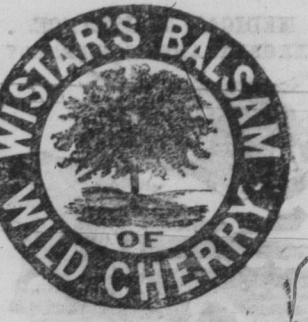
