our last meeting at Seltie  
before going away to Ottawa I promised to  
write you a letter. very sorry indeed that  
I didn't write sooner - however if this letter  
reaches you before coming away, will you  
kindly remember to the Chief Gen of Indian  
Affairs - when he favoured us with a  
visit September last - a question was  
brought before is notice by one of the  
Councilors. that we are anxious to get  
our Reserve surveyed - that each individual  
Indian belonging to the Reserve get his  
share of land according to the stipulations  
of the Treaty - I would like if this matter  
would be under the consideration of the  
Dept. <sup>above</sup> please why we broke some new  
land last summer - and we intend  
to break more the ensuing  
summer - on that account we would  
like to get our land surveyed.

Concerning about fisheries.  
I think it is a general satisfaction  
on the part of the Indians on this  
part of the Country - as long as we are  
allowed to catch & sell fish for dom-  
estic purposes - outside of that  
we are aware that we would have
