In the growing of Flax the farmer should content himself simply by producing the straw, either with or without the seed, and leave the subsequent conversion to those who have special appliances, and whose capital and skill can be more economically employed, Flax would then be much more generally cultivated; a ready market would be at hand as soon as it is harvested or pulled; and the farmer would have no occasion to object to the trouble and risk as now, which is liable to be catalled upon them in the subsequent manipulation of the crop.
