How Ruskin Re-Wrote.

For writers or would-be writers who think that to exhibit any sort of merit they should be able to "dash off" page after page of matter in practically the form in which it should remain, thete is instruction and encouragement, in the original manuscripts of Ruskin now offered for sale, It appears that Ruskin in the vigor of his mental powers was by no means dashy. Undoubtedly he yielded himself to the leading of genius, but he seems to have made a practice of leading genius laboriously back over the path that had been taken.

In comment on some of the pages of the manuscript now on exhibition, which are said to be the last unbought by collectors or institutions, it is said that they are written in a fine, flowing hand, but that they are crossed and accrossed with corrections and alterations, an evidence of Ruskin's care for expression at that time, in 1886 and afterward.

The development of one thought that was twice revised is shown, and Ruskin is quoted as asying that some of his sentences were "written four or five times over in my own hand and tried in every word for perhaps an hour — perhaps a foremoon — before they were passed ever to the printer. Even when the proofs came back from the printer he made considerable alterations in the text.
