Before an endowment scheme can be instituted or carried into effect there is a necessity for increasing the collegiate revenue so as to meet the obligations for the ensuing year. To aid this in part your Committee recommend in addition to the usual vote towards the salary of Professor of Modern Languages, that the Sum of Two hundred Dollars be placed at the disposal of the Board of Governors.

As year by year the Committee have the melancholy duty to place before you the lessening names on our roll, so this year, in view of the large number who have been called away, there seems the greater need of activity to those whe remain, in order that the prestige of the College may be maintained, and the love of Alma Mater fully proved.
