Twenty Lives Lost

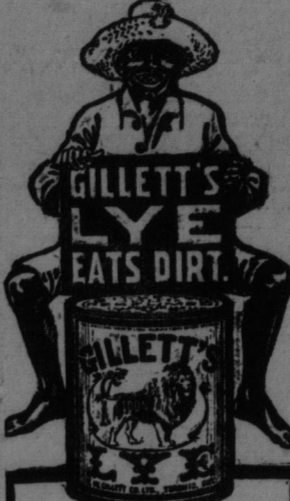
