

227,116 tons gross. Norway lost the largest number of ships, fifty-six(but their tonnage was 57,883 as compared with Great Britain's total of 115,546 gross tonnage of thirty six vessels destroyed.

The total shipping losses are estimat-ed:-Entente allies, about 75 per cent ; neutrals, nearly 18 per cent.; Teutonic losses less than 7 per cent.


