Is also Chairman of the Canadian Baptist Edifice Society. Declined a seat in the Can. Cabinet, 1865. Several important public measures owe their existence to Mr. M., viz.: the Act amending the Assessment Act of U. C. (1863); that consolidating and amending the Acts relating to Assessment of Property, U. C. (1866); and the highly useful measure for providing means of egress from Public Buildings (1866). As Chairman of the Committee on Municipal and Assessment Laws (1866), Mr. M. wrote and framed the greater part of the General Act on Municipal Corporations, &c. Sat for present seat in L.
