niary dealings with such District Council, under a penalty or penalties to be fixed in such letters patent of incorporation.

- 4. That no District Councillor shall continue in office for more than Three Years, unless re-elected.
- 5. That the District Council shall be presided over by a District Warden, to be appointed and be removable by Her Majesty, or by the Governor in the name of Her Majesty.
- 6. That a District Surveyor, who shall have passed an examination before a competent tribunal approved by the Governor, 10 shall be appointed in each district for superintending the construction of roads and other public works undertaken by authority of the District Council; and that the District Surveyor, and all other officers needed for the exercise of the powers of the District Council, shall be 15 appointed and be removable by the District Council, subject to the approval of the Governor.
- 7. That accounts in detail of all monies expended in every year by or under the authority of the District' Councils, be laid before the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly, 20 and otherwise published in such manner as may be directed by the Charter, or provided by any Act of the Legislature of the Province.

And be it Enacted, That the District Councils to be established in and by such Charters of Incorporation, shall have full power and 25 authority to make bye-laws for the making, maintaining or improving of any new or existing road, street or other convenient communications and means of transit within the limits of the district; for the stopping up, altering or diverting of any such road, street or other such communication as aforesaid; for the erection and repair of 30 bridges and public buildings that may be required for the convenience of the said district; for the superintendence and management of all property belonging to the district; for the collection, accounting for and application of all assessments raised under the authority of such District Council, and of the revenues belonging 35 to the said district, towards the payment of all necessary expenses incurred, or estimated as likely to be incurred, for the current year, or otherwise in respect of the local government of such district; and for any other purpose, matter or thing which shall be especially subjected to the direction and control of such Council by any Act of the Legis- 40 Lature of the Province of Canada, so that the same be not repugnant to the provisions of this Act or to any Act of the Legislature of the Province
