respective Rates and Duties paid for the same, to such Officer of Officers of Wis Wajeldy's Cultoms as shall be there appointed for that Purpole; and if any such Goods coming by Land Carriage of Inland Mavigation as afozesaid, shall pass by or beyond the said Place before named without Entry of Payment of the faid Rates and Duties, or shall be brought into any Part of the said Province by or through any other Place whatsoever, the faid Goods thall be forfeited; and every Person who shall be adicting, or otherwise concerned, in the bringing or removing such Goods, or to whose Hands the same hall come, knowing that they were brought or removed contrary to this Ad, thall forfeit Treble the Claive of such Goods; to be elimated and computed according to the best Price that each respective Commodity bears in the Town of Quebec at the Time such Offence shall be committed; and all the Boiles, Cattle, Boats, Clessels, and other Carriages whatsoever, made use of in the Removal, Carriage, or Conveyance of such Goods, shall be forfeited and lost, and shall and may be seized by any Officer of his Majelly's Customs, and profecuted as therein-after mentioned: And whereas there is Reason to apprehend, that the Regulations and Rectrictions contained in the faid herem-befoze recited Clause, so far as they relate to the bringing of Rum, Brandy, or other Spirits, into the Province of Quebec by Land Carriage, map, without further Explanation, operate to the Pzejudice and Disadvantage of the Commerce carried on with the Indians in the upper of interior Parts of the faid Province, we, Pour Wajchy's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Commons of Great Britain; in Parliament assembled, do most hums bly beleech Pour Wajelly that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's mod Excellent Wajelly, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Cempozal, and Commons, in this pietent Parlia-His Majesty's ment assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That Subjects may it hall and may be lawful to and for all his Hafelly's bring, by Land Subjects freely to bring, carry or convey, by Land Carriage, or Inland Mavigation, into any Parts of the 1910= vince of Quebec, not heretofore comprehended within the comprehended Limits thereof by his Majesty's Royal Proclamation of the Seventh of October, One thousand seven hundred of Od. 7, 1763, and Crty-three, any Duantity of Rum, Brandy, or other of Rum, Bran- Spirits, any Ching contained in the befoge-recited Act of Parliament to the contrary thereof in any wife notwiths standing.
