"It has been found, in the opinion of the Government, <u>necessary to have an agent residing</u> in the vicinity of Her Majesty's Government. With the growth of Canada, its increasing power and population, and its increasing interests as they are developed, it is found that the <u>correspondence</u> across the seas which the Government have to conduct, is <u>altogether unsatisfactory</u>, and that it will be well to have <u>a Minister residing</u> there".

> (<u>Note</u>: "Altogether unsatisfactory" character of correspondence.

Sir John adds, referring to emigration :-

I may say it has been found that <u>an agent</u> living in London, <u>without a commission</u>, <u>has not been able</u> <u>to claim anything like public attention</u> to that important subject.
