
Referring to application by Wm. Vass for Patent for Lot I4A, Range 5, and the E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  Lots I3, I4 & I5, Range 6, Dundee, I have to inform you that when application was made by James Vass accompanied by your report dated 12th March, 1894, for Patent, the lands described in report by the Department of Justice upon that application were given as follows;-
