Sir,-

In consequence of the report received from Inspector To relative to the award of Garden Competition prizes to Indians of your Agency; I beg to transmit herewith cheques Nos. 2865 to 28 in favour of the successful competitors, five of whom belong to Metlakatla, three to Aiyanish, three to Gwinoha and three to Ki colith.

The result of the Garden Competition cannot be regarded altogether satisfactory. It is observed from your report to the Inspector, copy of which he submitted to the Department, that co ain of the Indians of your Agency who made gardens were a from home fishing at the season of the year when their gardens re quired the greatest attention. The Department does not expect t Indians to neglect their fishing work in order to grow vegetable fruit. but desires that so far as is possible they shall do go. work in their gardens. It would seem that an impression prevail that it is necessary to hold an exhibit of vegetables and fruit the local school or some other convenient place. The Indians' gardens should be visited and the prizes awarded before the veget ables and fruit are garnered. It is desired that you and those persons who assist you in connection with the garden work shall d all that is possible during the present year to interest the Indiams generally in the Garden Competition and it is felt that it i an important matter to train them to raiss vegetables and fruits by so doing they will not only increase their food supplies b

provide themselves with more wholesome diet.
