I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 16th instant with which y u forwarded an account amounting to 114.50 from br. c.R. Young of Little Current, for professional services rendered to indians of Sucker Creek and Sheguiandah Bands for the months of December, January and February last, and in reply I beg to say that it is observed that you have amended the entries in the account with regard to the distance travelled by the Doctor in visiting his patients. It appears that in every case he made an error with regard to the distance travelled, and the Department desires to have you direct his attention to the matter. The correct mileage should always be stated. This fact should be made perfectly plain to the Doctor. Kindly also informing that he should guard against making too high charges for medicines.

The Doctor has charged \$15.00 for a visit made on the 7th June to John Oginah who suffers from rheumatism. An explanation with regard to this charge is desired. Explanations should also be furnished with regard to the charges of \$6.00 and \$7.00 respectively for metalines, which charges you will observe have been reduced. I may say that unless it was absolutely necessary for the Doctor to furnish drags of an expensive kind xxxxx, the charges referred to will not be allowed.
