

Ernest Egan - I did not know this boy.

R.P. 83(b.) complied with.

I recognise the accused. I saw him Wednesday evening, 6th June 1946. He was alone. He came into the house something around 2.30 to 2.35 hrs. We drank coffee together, then we drank one small glass, went to bathroom at 2.50 hrs. We were on the way in a jeep. There were seven in the jeep. Jan van der Kopput, Leo van der Kopput, Gohann van der Kopput, Hendrich van de Gode, myself, and two Canadians. I was in front next to the vehicle driver. The accused was driving. I don't know what happened then. It was not altogether dark. It was halfway to darkness. I do not remember ^{exactly} what vehicle after we left the house.

Ernest Egan - I was not present at an identification parade on 25th Feb 46 of Canadian soldiers. I do not remember the date but I think I was on one. I am not sure. I have a good memory. I have seen the accused since the 6th June but then I did not recognise him. My brother did not tell. I have not been talking to other witnesses the last time I found him changed very much, much fatter in the face. I recognise him now. He has changed. I was doubtful if it was him at the other parade. I did not know if it was him, I was doubting myself. It could not have been the other witness who was in the jeep.
