

in irrigation and other purposes and to afford drinking water for their stock, but so as not to exclude the cattle of settlers from using that portion of the water of lakes and ponds which can be used by such cattle from the banks of the portions of such lakes and ponds that are outside the Squiammy Reserve.

Woods Ferry Indians (20th July 1878)

Woklowach Reserve. On the Right Bank of the Nicola River at the junction of the Woklowach Stream.

* 30 inches from the Woklowach stream which flows Southwesterly through the Reserve into the Lower Nicola River, about 7 miles above Spier's Bridge.

* 20 inches from a stream which runs Westward through a high bench at the Southern end of the Woklowach Reserve.

Old Reserve containing about 30 acres on the Right Bank of the Thompson River in the angle formed by the junction of the Thompson and Nicola Rivers.

* 30 inches of water from any available source of water supply.

Reserve on the Right Bank of the Thompson River, at the mouth and on the Right Bank of the Spunkbank Stream.

* 50 inches
