United States legislation calling for the tuberculin test was immediately followed by a sharp decline in cattle quotations. This decline goes to show the great value of United States markets to Canadian cattle men. It is feared, however, that many drovers will lose money on their transactions. Last year about this date the market advanced sharply. Drovers, anticipating a similar advance this year, were resorted to have paid as high as \$8.50 in the country for choice heifers. The practical loss of the United States market is enough in itself to cause a set-back. In addition to this people are cutting down consumption of beef as are beyond the reach of the average purse. Quotations are: Choice, \$8.70 to \$9.50; common to good, \$5.45 to \$7.70; heifers, \$6.15 to \$7.15; choice cows, \$6.50 to \$7.45; cows to good, \$4.50 to \$6.50; butcher bulls, \$4.50 to \$7.75; feeders, \$6.50 to \$7.75; stockers, \$5.25 to \$6.75; canners and cutters, \$3.50 to \$4.50.

Milk cows are in the usual good demand. Choice, \$6.50 to \$11.00; cows to good, \$4.50 to \$6.50; averages, \$4.50 to \$11.00. Calves run from \$5 to \$11.50, according to size and quality.

Mutton is in strong demand: Wether 13 lbs., \$9 to \$10; hulk lambs, \$6.75 to \$9.25; ewes, \$5.25 to \$7.25; culls, \$3 to \$7.

In spite of heavy receipts from Western points hogs have advanced. In prices, packers now quoting between \$9.10 to \$9.35, and anything under that is quoted down to 28c, but there is little available until new hogs come in, in addition there is little likelihood of any New Zealand milk butter coming out, as it takes almost a month to get it here, and dealers are afraid that the market might go back in the meantime.

MONTREAL BUTTER—The market for cheese continues strictly a local affair, with the demand for local grades and dealers in the city here. The mail arrivals of the other side of the ocean are continued strong tone to the market there, with every evidence of a steady increase. There is no opening here at fairly high prices, probably 12c to 15c, perhaps even more.
