RESIGNED, SAYS REPORT. London, May 14.—An Exchange Telegraph Co. despatch from Copenhagen says Admiral von Tirpitz, erman Minister of Marine, is reported to have resigned as a result of a disagreement with other mem-

bers of the German government over the sinking of the Lusitania.
