Hog Quotations Reach \$10.25

Still another new high record point for hogs was reached last week when the quotation soared to \$10.25 per cut. The bulge came at the end of last week and despite the high price buyers snapped up every hog they could corral. Last week the total receipt for hogs numbered \$1.16%, and while they were not all of top quality, the packers were keen to tak them at the top price. As to whether hog prices have reached their limit the shippers are uncertain. There are those that say that as hogs have taken a drop in the castern and southern centre, that there will be a corresponding sum here. However, with farmers buy seeding and from the fact that many producers have shipped to the last notch, it is probable that the continued shortage will hold prices firm.

An idea of how keen the demand has

An idea of how keen the demand has been may be gained from the fact that in Friday last, some 808 hogs were received (the largest run of any one day for a long time) and the yards were deated out before 9.50 in the morning. During the past week choice weighty been brought as high as \$3.85 per cvt. while the bulk of sales ranged from \$4.00 to \$8.5.00. During the past week the receipts totalled 1,435 head of cattle and of these about 55 were sent east for export.
