C A P. IV.

An Ordinance to continue certain Acts of the Legislature of this Province, relating to the Establishment of Registry Offices.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to continue a certain Act of the Legislature of the Province of Lower Canada, passed in the eleventh year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled, "An Act to establish Registry Offices in the Counties of Drummond, Sherbrooke, Stanstead, Shefford, and "Missisquoi," in so far as the same is now in force; and another Act of the same Legislature, made and passed in the first year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act passed in the eleventh "year of the Reign of His late Majesty, intituled, 'An Act to establish Registry "Offices in the Counties of Drummond, Sherbrooke, Stanstead, Shefford, and "Missisquoi,' and to extend the provisions of the said Act;" and also another Act of the same Legislature, made and passed in the fourth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled, "An Act to extend the provi- "sions of the Act to establish Registry Offices in the Counties of Drummond, "Sherbrooke, Stanstead, Shefford, and Missisquoi, to lands held in free and com- "mon soccage in the Counties of Two Mountains and Acadie," which would otherwise expire on the first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight:—Be it therefore Ordained and Enacted by His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of this Province, authorized to execute the Com- mission
