ceived a Letter from Michael Wallace, Elquire, Acting Secretary of the Province, on the fubject of new Writs for the Town of Annapolis and the County of Sydney; and he laid the fame before the Houfe.

The faid Letter was read by the Clerk, and is as follows :

## Secretary's Office, Halifess, 3d Merch, 1808.

Lam commanded by his Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor to inform you that he has received by the January Mail from England, a Difpatch from my Lord Caftlereagh, one of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, communicating His Majefty's pleafure that a Writ may be iffued for the election of a Member to reprefent the Town of Annapolis, in the General Affembly of this Province; in the room of Thomas Walker; and I am further inftructed to acquaint you, that his Excellency has given order for the above Writ to be made out, and alfo one for the County of Sydney, in the room of Allan Chipman, whenever you require them.

Ordered, That the Letter do lie on the Table to be perused by the Members of the House.

On motion of Mr. Lawfon, *refolved*, that a Committee be appointed to wait on his Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, to request that he would be pleased to direct the Treasurer to render an account of the expenditure of the sum of five hundred pounds granted for the purchase of Furniture for the new Government-House, together with a list of such articles as have been purchased therewith.

Ordered, That Mr. Archibald, Mr. Lawfon, and Mz. Robertfon be a Committee accordingly.

Mr. Pearfon reported from the Committee for revising the Militia Lavzs, and forming a fystem for their improvement, and he read the report in his place, and afterwards delivered it in at the Clerk's table, where it was read and is as follows :

That the Committee have carefully revifed the Laws in force, and have also in obedience to the directions of the Houfe, had a communication with his Excellency, the Lieutenant Governor, on the fubject; and now beg leave to report to the Houfe the following propositions to ferve as a chief part of a basis for a Bill to be framed. First, That the prefert fythem of general organization for the Militia, be retained

with fome amendment.

- Second, That for the difciplining of the Militia a competent number of Iquad meetings for elementary inftruction and drill, he prefcribed by Law, under certain limitations of the time to be occupied in fuch meetings, and the extent of the local divisions from which fuch founds are to be drawn, and the number of company meetings be increased. The arrangement and regulation of both descriptions of meetings, and the mufters of battelions entire or in parts, to refe with the Governor or Commander in Chief and the officers under him.
- Third, That for the armament and complete equipment of the Militia, z fullcient number of mufkets or rifles with bayonets, with all neceffary accoutrements, in addition to the arms iffued by government, be imported into the Province, and fold at first cost and charges to all freeholders of full age, who are to arm themfelves at their own charge; minori and transfeat perform enrolled in the militia to be fupplied from those furnified by government.
