

The sum of 30% to improve the road from Little River to Loch Lomond.

The sum of 30% to the Commissioners for building a bridge across the Mispick River, at the foot of the Lake.

The sum of 15% for improving the road leading from the bridge at the foot of the large Loch Lomond, to the Black Settlement.

The sum of 15% to open a road from the Settlement at Tynemouth, on the Bay of Fundy, to the Quaco road.

The sum of 15% for improving the road from Gardiner's Creek to the Quaco road.

The sum of 100% for the road leading from the head of the large Loch Lomond to the Quaco Settlement.

YORK.

The sum of 100% towards completing the road from Daniel Hallett's, in St. Mary Parish, to the mouth of the Kiswick Creek, to commence where the improvements left off last year.

The sum of 40% toward completing the road from Estey's mill to the Cardigan Settlement, in the Parish of St. Mary.

The sum of 30% towards repairing the bridge over the Kiswick Creek near Estey's, in the Parish of St. Mary.

The sum of 50% towards improving the road from Jewett's, towards the new Settlement in the rear of Mactequack.

The sum of 70% towards erecting a bridge over the Mactequack Creek, below the Island in the said Creek.

The sum of 40% towards repairing the bridge over Long's Creek, in the Parish of Prince William.

The sum of 45% towards completing the bridge over Garden's Creek, in the Parish of Prince William.

The sum of 30% towards improving the road from William Harper's to John Parle's, in the Parish of Prince William.

The sum of 50% towards improving the road from Palmer's to the Poquiock, in the Parish of Prince William.

The sum of 50% towards improving the road from Joseph Woolverton's to Robert Phillip's, in the Parish of Northampton.

The sum of 75% towards improving the road from Robert Phillip's to the Beckaguimet Creek, in the Parish of Wakefield.

The sum of 40% towards improving the road from Elijah Tompkin's to the Monquart, in the Parishes of Wakefield and Kent.

The sum of 20% towards improving the road from the Magundy Settlement, in the Parish of Prince William, to the River.

Resolved, that there be granted to Wm. John Drummond, the sum of 211*l.* 8*s.* 3*d.* being the amount of expences incurred by him in opening the new Shepody road, laid out for settling Emigrants, by order of His Excellency the late Lieutenant-Governor.

And Mr. *Peters* further reported, that he was directed to ask for leave to sit again.

Ordered that the report be accepted, and leave granted.

The House then adjourned until to-morrow morning, at ten o'clock.
