The customary oaths were administred by the Honorable Robert Gray, Esq. and the Honorable Alexander Howe, Esq. two of His Majesty's Council, appointed by Dedimus Potestatem for that purpose, after which a Message was delivered by the Secretary from His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, informing the members that it was His Excellency's Command, that they immediately proceed to appoint a Speaker, and attend His Excellency in the Council Chamber.

C. Stewart, Esq. jun. one of the members from Prince County, stood up, and addressing the Clerk, proposed to the House Robert Hodgson, Esq. as their Speaker, which was seconded by P. Macgowan, Esq. member for Kings County.

J. B. Palmer, Esq. a member for Charlotte-Town, rose, addressed the Clerk, and proposed to the House J. F. Holland, Esq. member for Charlotte-Town, as their Speaker, which was seconded by A. M. Aulay, Esq. member for Queens County... The House then divided.
