THE LONE VOYAGERS.

Capt. Newman and son Edward arrived at Falmouth, England, in the 38 foot launch Abel Abbott Low, in which they sailed from New York, July 9. In an interview with a representative of the Associated Press, Captain Newman said: "The launch has proved a noble boat, but we experienced awful times since we left New York. Several times, in terrible gales, we nearly lost our drag anchor, owing to the gear chafing away. We voyaged 3,103 miles. We had great trouble with the kerosene because the tanks which held it broke and oil flooded the cabin. My boy became ill and homesick. I suffered greatly from exposure and sitting in one position. We spoke the American line steamer Kroonland, Aug. 1, in mid Atlantic. After this we encountered a series of most severe gales and the hardships were so great that I feared we would not survive. We did not speak another vessel until Aug. 1st, when we met a fisherman 90 miles off the belly Islands. Those last 90 miles were the longest I ever ran in my life. I would not hesitate, however, to try my voyage again."

CONSOLIDATED RURAL SCHOOLS

Commissioner Robertson of Ottawa, was in the province last week selecting locations for the McDonald rural schools. He selected Middleton as one place and on the 15th inst., he held a meeting there and fully explained the scheme. Prof. Robertson offered to Middleton and seven adjoining sections applying for the McDonald grant the following terms: If they would consolidate he would give \$5,000 or more if necessary for a building of six rooms in addition to the present accommodations at Middleton. An annual grant of \$1,500 or three years towards working expenses, provide the vans, equip the manual training, household science departments and provide the gardens for nature study. Also to provide the best obtainable teachers for these three new departments. The sections are to vote as much as the highest amount they have voted in any one of the past three years and Professor Robertson agreed to make up any deficit. After the speaker had finished a resolution was passed and accepted. Under the plan of these McDonald rural schools from five to eight small rural schools in the locality will be closed and the children from the whole area will be conveyed in vans to a central graded school. The main feature will be a small plot of ground for each child attending the school. This plot will be practically an out-of-door estate.
