VETERANS OF 1866

Arrangements Made for Annual Decoration Day the First Sunday in June.

The Veterans' Association of 1866 met at the Armories last evening, with President Chapman in the chair, and Comrades Black, Wilson, Drysdale, Wend and Riddell present. Owing to the indisposition of Secretary Burrows, Comrade Riddell was appointed secretary pro tem. President Chapman called attention to the near approach of the annual ceremony of Decoration Day, the first Sunday in June, when the graves of all those who have served in His Majesty's forces and whose last resting place is in Victoria Lawn should be fittingly remembered as in years past.

It moved by Comrades Black and Wilson that this Association carry out the usual memorial ceremonies of the decorations of graves of deceased comrades, and that the committee appointed last year be continued in office, and that the Secretary is hereby instructed to send invitations to the Mayor and aldermen of the city, the Daughters of the Empire, the Great War Veterans' and all military organizations, the 19th Regiment Band, and that the Rev. Canon Broughall be requested to address the Association at the cemetery. Sergt-Major Bill Stuart, late of the 17th Regiment, was duly elected a member of the Association. The meeting closed by singing the National Anthem.
