

"That the advice given to His Majesty, by His Ministers, whereby they obtained from His Majesty a pledge that a sufficient number of Peers would be created to pass a Parliament Bill, in the shape in which it left this House, is a gross violation of constitutional liberty, by which, among other consequences, the people will be precluded from again pronouncing upon the policy of Home Rule.'

The former Unionist Premier emphasized that he was conscious of the gravity of the situation and the seriousness of the step which he asked the House to take. He thought that it would be admitted that never in all case, or one which more urgently deserved or required the consideration of Parliament and the emphatic conlemnation of Ministers.
