convict named Jacob Mkaba, at Dutoitspan Convict Station. The story for the Crown was that Jacob had decided to withdraw from the "Ninevite Society." abdicating the chieftainship, and had persuaded others to withdraw also. Superintendent Dyason said the Ninevites caused immense trouble in the stations, and although watched continually, held meetings and re ported to their king. The head of the society was in Pretoria, and was recognized throughout the Union prisons. Jacob's fellow convicts had recently called him a detective to watch and protect Jacob. Witness added that the lives of the witnes in the present case would certainly be endangered after the proceedings. One of the accused admitted stabbing the deceased "under orders from Pretoria." because it was thought that it was through him that two convicts had been shot at the Cinderella Prison.
