A citizen of an incorporated Canadian city in reviewing public debts, revenues and expenditure which he is called upon to face, must direct his attention to three sets of finance. One set is that of the city he dwells in: the second set is that of the province in which his city is located, and the third set is that of the Dominion. He has therefore three sets of burdnes to bear. In Newfoundland it is different. The whole public debt, Colony and City, is included in an statement issued by the Finance Minister in his Budget Speech. For instance the Public Debt to 30th June, 1913, vas shown in the statement issued in the last Budget as \$29,470.060.54. A note appended showed this sum included \$1,429,104,022 of the Municipal Debt

with that of such a city as Vancouver, B.C., as will be seen by a perusal of figures which we othain from the Twenty-Seventh Annual Report of the Vancouver Board of Trade.

The outstanding debentures and stock of the Vancouver City Corporation is given on Dec. 31st, 1913, is given as \$30,788,585.46. The population is given as 114,220. This gives a city per capita debt of \$269.

In contrast to this we have a city debt in St. John's of \$1,429,104.22. borne by 32,292 (1911 Census). This gives a per capita debt of \$44.

In other words the debenture debt

of the Vancouver City Corporation is six times as large as that of the St. John's City Corporation, reckoned on a per capita basis.

It is of course true that St. John's is backward as far as needed improvements is concerned. But the fact remains that if St. John's could raise on debentures and spend a Million and a half on such improvements, the per capita debt of the city would still be three times less than a.m. to-day, to take up her regular that of the Vancouver City Corpora-
