His firm is now trying to arrange to have a Donaldson liner, the Alconda, come here for a cargo of paper from the Grand Falls mills and touch at Sydney on the way and bring down about 6,000 tons of coal. This is not yet finalized, as it depends upon arrangements for the outward freight, and these are not concluded, but he hopes that the matter will go through.
