Under the provisions of the War Measures Act, 1914, and the Acts in amendment thereof, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to order that Regulation No. 3, regarding Lights, dated 16th July last, shall be cancelled, and the following substituted therefor, namely:
Headlights used on any motor cars or motor cycles in or near the City of St. John's, or in or near any settlement in the Districts of St. John's East or West, or on any road approaching St. John's or any of the said settlements upon which lights may be visible at sea, shall be obscured by having the whole of the lower half of the lens of each headlight covered by some substance or painted, in such a manner as to prevent any light showing through. Electric bulbs or other lights of more than fifteen candle power shall not be used in headlights of any such motor car or motor cycle.
