A great feature of his sojourn in Lahore will be a review of pensioned Indian officers at the Minto Park, to be followed by sports and illuminations. Stopping en route at Sialkot to see the garrison there, His Royal Highness, on March 2nd, will reach Jammu, the winter headquarters of the Maharaja of Kashmir and Jammu. From this State went forth many thousands of its subjects to fight for the Allies in the war, and

At Jammu the Prince will come the nearest in his tour to the civilization under Northern Buddhism and will see interesting spectacles such as no other centre of his journeyings can offer.
