Toronto, Nov. 24-11 p.m.—A depression

which was in Manitoba last night is moving

across the northern part of the Lake Region,

causing strong winds and rains from southwest

and south on the lakes. Light snow has fallen

at many points in Eastern Ontario and in

Quebec, and fine weather has pre-

valled in other parts of Canada. Minimum

and maximum temperatures: Calgary, 40-50;

Qu'Appelle, 34-45; Winnipeg, 37-44; Port

Arthur, 21-45; Montreal, 14-30; Quebec, 12-

37; Halifax, 29-30; storm signals are dis-

played throughout Canada.
