DAILY HINTS TO HOUSE-

BREAKFAST — Bananas. Hominy. Breaded Lamb Chops. Fried Potatoes. Baking Powder Coffee. DINNER-Cod Steak. Mashed Potatoes. Baked Tomatoes. Spinach.

Radishes. Apple Pie. Celery. SUPPER - Fresh Graham Bread. Butter. Omelet. Apple Sauce. Cookies. Cocoa.

GRAHAM BREAD. One pint warm water, 1-4 cake of compressed yeast, 1 scant tablespoon of salt, 2 tablespoons of molasses, 1-4 teaspoon of soda. Mix altogether and stir in graham flour to make a dough as stiff as it can be stirred. Fill small tin pans half full; keep warm; when pans are full put into

quick oven. Bake from 1-2 to 3-4 of an hour. Excellent warm for tea.
