BODIES RECOVERED

BY YACHTING PARTY

DETROIT, Aug. 11.—At almost the same moment, the bodies of Cottrell E. Brooks, and William G. Luckell, who were drowned from a canoe in Lake St. Clair Sunday evening, were found today by two parties of yachters. The bodies were some distance apart, about a mile off shore. Luckell's body was discovered by three men in a launch coming down from Pearl Beach. Capt. O. C. Ingalshe found Brooks, both salesmen, were week-end guests of J. Lee Barrett, at 1006 Lake Shore road. They put out in a canoe just before a stiff wind blew up from the northwest. An aeroplane and several motor boats searched the lake in vain for signs of them after they failed to return.

NOT ALARMED OVER

COMPETITION FROM

HYDRO COMMISSION

Edison Company's Manager

Discusses Situation At

Port Huron.

SARNIA, Aug. 11.—"The Ontario Hydro Commission can supply a 24-hour service at a lower rate than the Edison Company, but I cannot see that it will be to the advantage of the St. Clair River Tunnel Company to buy hydro power," said Lethrop Dow of the Detroit Edison Company in Port Huron, when questioned regarding his company's attitude toward the plan which Mayor Crawford of Sarnia is favoring. Speaking of the possibility of Ontario hydro power making inroads on the Detroit Edison's territory, both in Port Huron and Detroit, Mr. Dow stated that the big Michigan power organization was not alarmed at the prospect. He

pointed out that the Edison Company's rates to manufacturing firms in Port Huron and Detroit were much lower than those which could be given by the hydro commission, and gave as the explanation the difference in the securing of power by the two organizations.

Forwarded Debentures.

City Treasurer P. A. Blackburn today forwarded to Wood, Gundy & Co., Toronto, \$25,000 worth of city of Sarnia debentures, for which that firm has found a market. This is another allotment of the recent \$250,000 issue, consisting of \$50,000 for waterworks improvements and \$200,000 of Collectate and Technical School bonds, on which the Wood, Gundy Company and R. C. Matthews Company were given options. These options have been given being extended, the last extension being granted on Tuesday. School bonds to the extent of \$110,000 had been previously taken up by the first-named company.

IN CRITICAL CONDITION.

WOODSTOCK, Aug. 11.—R. N. Ball, crown attorney of Oxford County, is in a critical condition in a Toronto Hospital where he underwent an operation on Wednesday. His medical attendant stated today that he had a chance to pull through but that there was danger of peritonitis setting in, in which case there would be practically no hope of his recovery.
