Price, Port Townsend, a gentleman of w experience in the iron and steel bi ness, who is now in the city, helie the time is ripe for the establishm of an iron smelter on Vancouver isla He has visited, personally, the va ous deposits of iron found on the coi Vancouver island, he believes, is r in ores, and there is sufficient to m the supply for smelters for a hundry years. He says nearly every inlet the West Coast of the island has in deposits, and again along the east si including Texada island, this is ce tinned. He advocates putting up of smelter of about 150 tons capacity day if coke is used, or if charcoal to be utilized, the capacity might a little less. This would cost abo \$350,000.
