London, Nov. 21—Queen Mary has sent a bridal gift to Miss Iris Fitzgeorge, in whose veins flows royal blood, who will soon marry Robert Shakleton Balfour.

Miss Fitzgeorge, who has appeared on both the amateur and professional stage, is a cousin of both King George and Queen Mary. She is a granddaughter of the late Duke of Cambridge, who defied Queen Victoria and married Miss Fairbrother, a beautiful and famous dancer. Queen Victoria refused her consent to the marriage, which was necessary under the Royal Marriage Act of 1772.

Miss Iris and her talented sister, Daphne, a writer, have no stands at the Court of St. James. They cannot even sit at table at any court function, and are the "hard luck cousins of royalty".

However, King George has given special permission for Miss Iris to be married in the Chapel Royal, St. James' Palace.

London, Nov. 25—Returns today from Saturday's polling at Bolton in the bye-election caused by the death of George Hardwood, shows the figures to be—S. Taylor, (Liberal), 10,011; A. Brooks, (Con.), 8,835.

CROWDING THROUGH DOMINION GATEWAYS

Immigration Figures For Seven Months Show Gain of 35,000 Over Last Year

Winnipeg, Man., Nov. 26—Returns compiled by J. Bruce Walker, commissioner of immigration, estimates the total number of immigrants entering Canada during the seven months from April to October, at 300,841 as against 263,833 for the corresponding period last year. This is an increase of 35,008 or 13 per cent.

The highest increase shown was in August, which showed a gain of 49 per cent.

Robert Rogers has promised to have surveys and estimates made for the proposed canals in connect Lake Manitoba and Winnipeg and also the last named lake with the Saskatchewan River; also canals to connect Lake Manitoba with Lake Winnipeg via the Waterhen River, Lake St. Martin and the Daphne River with continuous navigation on these rivers.

ODD SCRAP OF OLD LONDON FOUND

Coroner's Jury See Tramp Living in Panelled House

Scraps of old London come to light in the oddest ways, and it was at the inquest on a Southwark shoeblack recently that the history of a wonderful old house, once the home of earls and now a caravansary of tramps, was told. The shoeblack died in it, and the Coroner, who happens to have a taste in these things told the jury he knew the place well, and that it has a fine old staircase.

It is to be found in a grim by-way off Lamb street, where Dickens lived and suffered as a boy. Passing through a slit in the yellow building behind which the old house lurks in its last decay is a sort of flagged pit, all that is left of a lordly courtyard, and in front of a tall dark door always open for a lodger seeking a threepenny bed.

On each half of the panelled door hangs a sound old knocker, and above the door richly carved corbels, such as could be matched in some of the finest of the old Westminster houses, once supported a canopy, but now only a few deal boards laid across.

The surprising thing inside is to find a beautiful staircase, either Jacobean or Carolinian, twisting up to painfully scrubbed corridors off which the lodgers slept in the oak panelled rooms.

Many of the original balusters are left, concealing their grace under paint. The whole place is panelled from top to bottom, all hidden, too, under gray paint, so that you have to look long to discover the refinement of the cornices. In one room an over mantel carved with foliage and flowers is a delightful find.

In a panel over the fireplace of one of these strange tramp haunted rooms is a painting of the house as it used to be with its courtyard and gardens, and on another wall are revealed the spectral vestiges of painted, women, just a hint of beauty all bearded and ruined.
