### WHY?

Because nature has gifted it with unlimited and controllable water power which will be immediately utilized for manufacturing purposes on a large scale. Because seven lines of Railway are projected or are in course of construction, viz., C.P.R., G.T.R., North Pacific R.R., Minnesota and S. Ste. Marie R.R., G.R. and I.R.R., Canada Atlantic R.R., and the D. M. and M.R.R. Because it is situated at the Hub of Lakes Superior, Huron and Michigan, and must be the wholesale centre and distributing point for the whole of the Lake trade. The C.P.R., G.T.R. and other Roads large sums in erecting their stations, road houses, workshops, etc. The great International Bridge is now being constructed and the Higgins Syndicate of Ashland and Minneapolis, who have purchased the Laird mill site are surveying the channels which run between St. Mary's Island and the Canadian Main land, with a view to deepen them so as to give the necessary volume of water power all the year round, and propose to spend one million dollars in the next two years, making such improvements as will guarantee ample water power for scores of mills at the minimum cost. The natural advantages of the "Soo" in shipping, railways, manufacturing and mining are perhaps greater than any other point in America. The products of the immense wheat belt of Manitoba, Dakota, Minnesota, Wisconsin and the Northwest, also the minerals, lumber, etc., must find an outlet by Sault Ste. Marie just as surely as the water finds the ocean.

Millers find the water supply at Minneapolis insufficient at certain seasons of the year and are already making preparations to establish large Flouring and Pulp Mills at the "Soo."
