Def Goods.

There is little or nothing to report in the dry goods trade so far as transactions are concerned. This is the commencement of the "between season" period and duhess is the rule. Preparations are going on in the wholesale houses for the fall trade. Goods are coming in from Europe and from the Canadian mills. The firm prices which have been ruling for the past 6 weeks are still well maintained and the prespect is that in Canadian cottons and woollens there will be a continuance of them. An arrangement has been entered into by several of the mills to reduce the output rather that lower the prices. Payments are, as a whole, fair considering the season. Manufacturing towns and lumbering districts respond promptly but the agricultural districts are slow and behind-hand.

Greceries.

At Grand's to-day 20 out of the 25 horses of-fered were sold. Work horses brought from \$30 to \$135 each and drivers from \$100 to \$150. Trade during the week has been rather dull, and nothing like a lively business is now ex-pected before September.

Live Stock. There were 28 loads of live stock offered at

There were 28 loads of live stock offered at the western cattle yards to-day, including about 300 sheep and lambs, 75 calves and 200 hogs. For export cattle really choice stock were in demand, but the bulk of the offerings were of inferior quality. All offered, however, were taken, as buyers having ocean freight space engaged had to buy to fill it. Butchers, cattle were not in as good demand as in the early part of the week and the market was depressed. No outside buyers were present and some of the stock was left over. Export sheep were in good demand and the market was firm. All were sold. Butchers' sheep were allittle off. Not a great many were offered and the demand was hardly moderate. There were rather too many lambs in for the demand and prices were lower. The market in hogse was firm but there was no change in prices. All descriptions were wanted and more could have been sold had they been offered.
