ROASTED IN A FIRE TRAP.

HELPLESS CRIPPLES CREMATED IN INDIANAPOLIS.

The Surgical Institution Fire Proves to Have Resulted in Terrible Slag Heaps—Upward of a Score of Patients Buried Beyond Recognition and Nearly 50 Others Terribly Injured.

Indianapolis, Ind., Jan. 22.—The fire at the Indiana Surgical Institution last night was more serious than heretofore reported. The flames broke out just before midnight from the main building, a four-story structure from the main building by a narrow bridge. Before the fire was discovered the whole institution was a mass of flames.

Where Death Ran Riot.

On the third and fourth floors the horrible work was done. The buildings were a network of narrow halls, entrances and stairways. The fire could not have been contained by the fire department.

Rooms on the third and fourth floors of the main building and nearest the alley were the scenes of the greatest fatalities.

In one room were two women, both of whom perished.

The entire rear portion of the inside of the Georgia-street portion of the building fell in. The debris covered the alley on the first story, and when the firemen began their search for the dead bodies they were obliged to commence work on level with the first story.

Twenty Killed.

Seventeen bodies were found in the wreck, and a victim died to-day, making a total of 23.

The injured number 21, of whom four will die.

Five bodies were taken out this morning. They were roasted alive, the skin having peeled off, and the faces were burned off.

This afternoon the ashes and cinders were washed from the ground and the blackened remains.

THE BOND-BLAINE TREATY.
